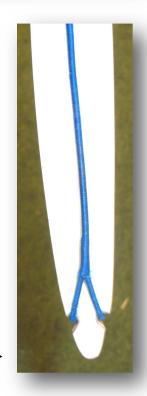
Handy Guide to Bow Stringing: Part 1



Step 1: Select an appropriate poundage bow from the cupboard. We store the bows with the string on the wrong side, so when you first get one out it should look like this.

Always check that there's no damage to any of the equipment you're using. ■ Step 2: Slide the top loop of the string down the top limb.

Step 3: Rotate the bottom loop of the string onto the correct side of the bow and settle it into the grooves in the end of the bottom limb.



Step 4: The bow should now look like this.

If it doesn't, ask for help! ©

If it does, grab yourself a bow stringer and

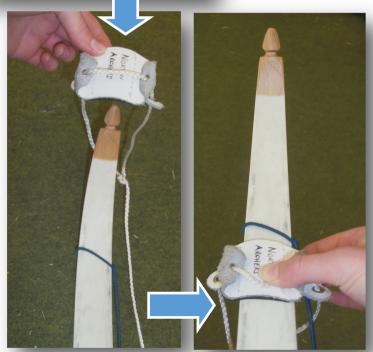


■ **Step 5:** Slide the flat end of the bow stringer onto the top limb and position it underneath the string, as shown.

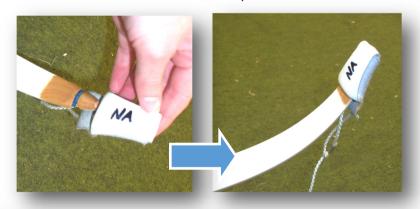
Top Tip: Once you put the bow stringer onto the bow, try not to move the bow, otherwise the string and the stringer might get tangled!

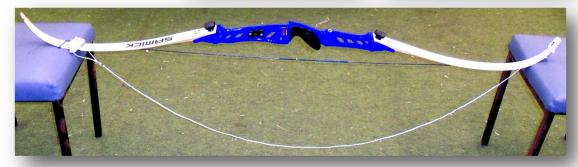

Step 6: Slip the pocket end of the bow stringer over the end of the bottom limb, being careful not to dislodge the string from the grooves in the limb. ▼



Step 7: The bow should now look like this. If it doesn't, ask for help! ☺ If it does, move on to Part 3! ▼

Handy Guide to Bow Stringing: Part 3



▲ Step 8: Put your thumb on the flat bit of the bow stringer on the top limb, then stand on the string bit of the bow stringer and pull the riser up towards you.

Step 10: Remove the stringer carefully from the bottom limb and check that the string is still sitting securely in the grooves there.
Check again that the string is sitting securely on the top limb when you take the stringer off that end, too.

And you're done! ©

Step 9: Keep your thumb on the top of the bow stringer until it takes the strain for you, then push the top loop of the string up the top limb and settle it carefully in the grooves there.
